Dear Parent / Guardian,

At the end of the summer term, St George's School would like to support the Ronaken Project in Nakuru Kenya.

Nakuru is the fourth largest town in Kenya, and the project is aimed at supporting extremely deprived children living in a slum area. The children do not have access to any basic amenities, and education isn't free. The project aims to ensure that many children have the chance to have a valuable education that otherwise they would not get. By working closely with the children in Nakuru, volunteers aim to enrich the lives of children by providing valuable education, shelter, food and clothing.

At present, the children wear a uniform at school, but for some, are the only clothes they own. The luxury of disposing of clothes with holes or that are too small is alien to the children; hence the project would like to appeal for clothing that they can take to the children, in particular school jumpers.

As you are aware, the school will have a brand new uniform in September and we would like to take this opportunity to donate the old school uniform jumpers to this valuable and worthy cause.

A donation box will be set up in Lower School on Monday 9th July 2018 so that if you would like to donate to this charity, your child's old St George's school jumpers can be left at school on the last day of term.
