e understand the importance of language and communication. A vocabulary rich environment being key to building independent learners who are confident in getting their needs met.

Inside the classrooms there are specific learning zones which have been created to support the seven key areas of learning and development in the EYFS curriculum, from a cosy reading corner, where children can share stories, to an ever-changing role play area to support social and emotional development.

However, learning doesn't end indoors; the children have access to the outdoor classroom and playground as well as our nature areas. These have been carefully designed with different zones to foster a love of the natural world and to support physical and social development.

Emergent writing and opportunities to mark make are threaded throughout all areas.

We have a large green field in the grounds that gives the children opportunities to

run and spot the changes in the seasons: from running through crunchy autumnal leaves, to wearing raincoats and going on muddy walks, or having a teddy bear picnic in the Summer and bug hunts in Spring!

We follow the children's interests, preparing them for school in a nurturing environment.

RECEPTION **AT ST GEORGE'S**

PREP SCHOOL (YEARS 1 - 6)


The development of the individual child continues in small classes under the care and leadership of highly trained teachers, helping build student confidence and enthusiasm.

SPORT

Your child will have two hours of PE each week. The sporting curriculum includes gymnastics, dance, athletics, tennis, games (including traditional ball games) and orienteering.

e benefit rom sharing facilities with our Senior School, accessing the tennis and basketball courts, gymnasium and playing fields.

Lessons are complemented by a variety of after school clubs. Swimming lessons are offered from Year 1 onwards. Older students have the opportunity to participate in sporting fixtures both home and away, and there are interhouse sporting competitions throughout the year.





ICT

We aim for our children to be digitally literate, to be able to use and express themselves as they learn to use information and communication technology.

here is a purposebuilt ICT suite where each child can work at their own desktop computer.

All classrooms have interactive white boards and access to individual laptops and I-pads.

We deliver the National Curriculum for Coding from Year 1 onwards, the core of which is computer science. Pupils are taught the principles of information and computation, how digital systems work and how to put this knowledge to use through programming. There is a comprehensive programme of E-Safety education.



REAND PSHE

The school places great emphasis on the moral and personal development of students.

SHE lessons run weekly for all years. Each class is taught a range of important topics that help pupils become well rounded, informed individuals who will be able to flourish in their lives beyond St Georges. We cover a huge variety of ageappropriate topics such as kindness, feelings, resilience, mental and physical health and well-being.

Pupils are encouraged to reflect, debate and articulate their thoughts and beliefs in a respectful manner. We believe that pupils who leave the school do so with confidence and security giving them a firm foundation to build on.

Our Religious Education programme encompasses all major religions. Children are encouraged to discuss issues of importance and respect the views and beliefs of others.

We host weekly assemblies which celebrate the children's work, behaviour, attitudes to learning and individual qualities. Parents are welcome to attend many of our assemblies, including our Harvest Festival, Christmas Productions, the termly Progress Awards celebration, as well as class assemblies and performances.



THE UN CONVENTION ON THE **RIGHTS OF A CHILD**

St George's is a recognised 'Gold' Right's Respecting School. Our children are responsible citizens both in school and in the wider community.

ur pupils feel empowered about their education and gain a deeper understanding of how their behaviour and actions affect the rights of others.

how other people's rights are being met or denied. Each class decides on shared agreements for the learning environment, identifying how they will respect each other's right to an education.

COMMUNICATION

Parents can keep up-to-date with their children's learning in school through our virtual platform Class Dojo.

ass Dojo is a user-friendly virtual learning space which can be accessed via the internet or through an app. It is used to share news and events in school, details about homework and celebrations from our weekly 'Good Work' and 'Star of the Week' assemblies. Parents can also contact their child's

class teacher through a direct messaging service if they have any queries.

Each term you will be provided with an overview of the curriculum content, alongside a termly Parent's Evening where progress and attainment will be shared with you. A full written report is provided at the end of the school year.





EXTRA-CURRICULAR **ACTIVITIES**

The children are encouraged to extend their interests by participating in activities from a diverse menu of extracurricular opportunities.

hese are available as clubs. themed afternoons, visitors and trips. There is something to suit everybody! Each term our active School Council choose the clubs the children would like to have.

Qualified and talented tutors provide peripatetic tuition in a range of musical instruments. The children have the opportunity to take ABRSM graded exams. They are encouraged to perform individually and as part of ensemble groups.

Lessons in the classroom are regularly enhanced with visitors to the school and trips to various places of interest in and around Birmingham. Our school calendar is always full of events, trips and activities, from experiencing lessons in a Victorian schoolroom, to becoming student astronauts in a space mission simulator!

In addition to curricular day trips and educational visits, older children have the opportunity to experience residential outdoor pursuits that engage them in activities requiring teamwork, cooperation and lateral thinking.
